
Khan Academy Lesson

Pre-Calculus STEM Honors

Today, you will be working with Khan Academy's SAT preparation program. Through this program, you will take practice SAT tests and view your results. After taking practice tests, Khan Academy computes your skill level for each math standard, and offers you lessons, videos, practice questions, and tips on the standards that could use improvement. According to the College Board, 20 hours of practice on Khan Academy is associated with an average 115-point score increase on the SAT.






Directions:

- Create a Khan Academy account, or login to your account if you already have one. You MUST be logged-in to save your results, otherwise will have to start over next time.
- Agree to link your Khan Academy and College Board accounts and share your info with me when prompted.

• Sign in to Collegeboard.org or create an account (to get customized practice and recommendations just for you). Hit "Send" to send your scores.




Near the top of the Khan Academy screen, click on the "Practice" tab.


